What's the "Skinny" on Mucocutaneous Diseases

A variety of diseases, many of which are autoimmune in nature, affect both skin and mucous membranes. Some of these diseases begin in the mouth, only to progress to involve the skin and other mucosal sites. The prognosis for these diseases ranges from a mild annoyance to potentially fatal if not treated. This program is designed to provide dentists, dental hygienists, and dental assistants with clinically relevant information to use in their daily practice of dentistry.

Oral Manifestations of Systemic Diseases: What Lurks Below the Clavicles

While the majority of oral disease is "dental" in nature, i.e., caries and periodontal disease, there are a significant number of systemic diseases that affect the oral mucosa, soft tissues, jaws and teeth. This program is designed to update members of the dental team on the more common and significant systemic diseases and conditions that can be expected to occur in a contemporary dental practice.
